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Purpose. Definitions.

- (2) **Small PHA** - A PHA that is not designated as PHAS or SEMAP troubled, or at risk of being designated as troubled, that owns or manages less than 250 public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550.
- (3) **Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA** - A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment, and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) **Standard PHA** - A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS and SEMAP assessments.
- (5) **Troubled PHA** - A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) **Qualified PHA** - A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined, and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

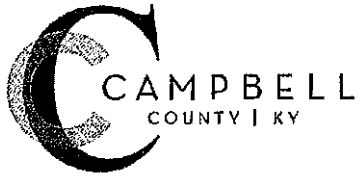

Fair Market Rent Calculation Methodology

Show/Hide Methodology Narrative

Fair Market Rents for metropolitan areas and non-metropolitan FMR areas are developed as follows:

1. **Calculate the Base Rent:** HUD uses 2016-2020 5-year American Community Survey (ACS) estimates of 2-bedroom adjusted standard quality gross rents calculated for each FMR area as the new basis for FY2023, provided the estimate is statistically reliable. For FY2023, the test for reliability is whether the margin of error for the estimate is less than 50% of the estimate itself and whether the ACS estimate is based on at least 100 survey cases. HUD does not receive the exact number of survey cases, but rather a categorical variable known as the count indicator indicating a range of cases. An estimate based on at least 100 cases corresponds to a count indicator of 4 or higher.

If an area does not have a reliable 2016-2020 5-year estimate, HUD checks whether the area has had at least 1 minimally reliable estimate in any of the past 3 years, or estimates that meet the 50% margin of error test described above. If so, the FY2023 base rent is the average of the inflated ACS estimates.

If an area has not had a minimally reliable estimate in the past 3 years, HUD uses the estimate for the area's corresponding metropolitan area (if applicable) or State non-metropolitan area as the basis for FY2023.

2. **Calculate the Basis for Recent Mover Adjustment Factor:** HUD has changed the calculation of the FY2023 Recent Mover Factor from previous years due to the unavailability of ACS₂₀₂₀ 1-year estimates. The Census Bureau did not release standard 1-year estimates from the 2020 American Community Survey (ACS) due to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on data collection. For FY2023, HUD uses a multi-pronged approach that includes private sources of rental data.

Deconcentration

"A major goal of HUD's Annual Performance Plan is to ensure that a certain percentage of low income families live in low poverty areas (which is defined as a geographic area with concentration of less than 20% low income families)."

In the Greater Cincinnati Metropolitan Area, 12.1% of the overall population is below the poverty line. 69% of housing is owner-occupied and 94% of all housing units are occupied.

Housing Needs and Strategy for Addressing Housing Needs

The jurisdiction served by Campbell County Department of Housing (CCDH) includes the counties of Campbell and Pendleton, excepting the city of Newport. CCDH is generally well-equipped to meet the needs of applicants and participants, however, the past two years have seen a decrease in availability of all unit types and a substantial increase in contract rents. The jurisdiction consistently has a need for both assisted and unassisted housing for the elderly and disabled. 49% of families assisted by CCDH are elderly or near elderly and 59% of participants reporting income receive benefits from the Social Security Administration.

Last Fiscal Year more than 84% of applicants reported incomes below 30% of area median income. Despite the majority of applicants reporting extremely low-income, the majority of the agency's families are housed in low-poverty areas.

Reporting on December 8, 2022 indicates 541 minors are housed with CCDH.

48% of assisted units are one bedroom. 27% of assisted units are two bedrooms. 20% of units are three bedrooms. 4% of units are four bedrooms. 1% of units are five or six bedrooms. There is a need for larger (4+) unit sizes. CCDH conducts regular owner outreach, focusing on owner education. CCDH also works with local officials, endeavoring to increase housing opportunities for program participants and improve the public's perception of the program.

Program applicants on December 8, 2022 reported as 47.72% white, 45.87% black, .68% American Indian / Alaska Native, .39% Asian, .39% Hawaiian / Pacific Islander, 4.96% Multi-Racial or declined to report. 96.7% reported as non-Hispanic and 3.3% as Hispanic.
